## 2010 HIGHLIGHTS

### The Future We Desire Maximizing Impact

What if one day, community food banks closed their doors, school lunch programs were no longer served and shelters to protect people from family violence were non-existent? The success would not be rooted in the failure of these necessary services, but because our community didn't have to face the challenges any longer.

We know this may not seem realistic and that many issues will always exist to some degree. Yet, it's a vision that we keep at the forefront as we focus our efforts and work together to bring about positive and sustained in our community. This Report to the Community highlights the great work and success that is being achieved. It is our work together, and the scope of issues that we are impacting that is helping to bring our imaginative picture closer to reality.

### Children and Youth

The future of our society depends on the health and well-being of our children. At United Way, we believe that investing wisely into generations of healthy children, will result in a lifetime of healthier, productive communities.

### The Early Years:

Getting the right start in life makes all the difference in the growth and development of a child. Part of this is the importance of living in a healthy, safe environment. When families are supported, children are supported.

Success By 6®, an initiative managed by United Way, recognized that a strong collaboration among early learning and care providers is the best approach to maximizing opportunities for children in our community. Thanks to a grant from the Early Learning Branch of Alberta Education, the Early Years Continuum Project was launched in 2010. By identifying gaps in the services currently available for families with young children, this three-year project will help build strong working partnerships among service providers so that families can make a smooth transition from one service or program to another. The work will continue through 2013 and the findings from the project will be extremely important in helping to build an accessible, comprehensive and cohesive range of early childhood services in Alberta.

Partnerships are the cornerstone for much of what we do at United Way. The longest-serving foundational model for successful community collaboration we have is Partners for Kids. PFK uses a wraparound approach to services, meaning that children, youth and families learn the skills they need to succeed both at school and in the community. In 2010, with the continued contribution of many community partners and sector supports, the PFK concept grew to include 13 elementary and junior high schools, reaching more than 1,400 students in the Alberta Capital Region.

## Guiding our Community's Youth:

Everyone needs a role model. For youth, role models aren't only important, they can mean the difference between a life of ongoing struggle and one of fulfillment, where youth feel confident through the middle years, go on to complete high school and even take the next step into post-secondary education.

The Boys and Girls Club of Fort Saskatchewan plays an integral role in the development of healthy youth in their community. In 2010, their Youth Development Program provided more than 500 young residents with a safe, supervised place to go after school where they learned valuable life skills that will aid them in their growth to healthy adulthood.

## Families and Individuals

Families are the foundation of a community. Each and every day, there are families that will need help and support. For some, the challenges are more critical - one of the most serious issues is homelessness.

There are many reasons people become homeless. Some of these include: leaving an abusive relationship, loss of employment, death of a major income earner, physical or mental disabilities, addictions, disasters (fire and flooding), "runaway" children/youth, or re-integration into society after incarceration or increased housing costs and loss of income. No matter what the circumstance, everyone deserves to have a safe place to call home. However, providing someone with a home and not following up with the necessary supports to help them stay there creates an additional challenge.

United Way has actively supported Edmonton's 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness by providing coordination for Homeless Connect and leadership and support to the Homeless Commission.

Many homeless Albertans are confronted with not having personal identification, creating a domino effect that makes it harder to secure resources for a home. To address this challenge, United Way and the Homeless Commission have partnered to support the creation of a safe ID storage site on a pilot project basis.

As part of their 2010 United Way campaign, Enbridge Pipelines, in collaboration with United Way and the Homeless Commission, pledged to support Welcome Home for the next two years, with a \$100,000 United Way donation in the first year. Welcome Home is a volunteer driven program that will match volunteers from the faith community with newly housed people leaving homelessness to address their loneliness and social isolation.





THE 2010 HOMELESS COUNT IN **EDMONTON** REVEALED THAT A TOTAL OF **2,421** INDIVIDUALS ARE **STILL** LIVING **WITHOUT** A PROPER HOME, BUT THE **NUMBER** OF INDIVIDUALS HAS DECREASED BY 658 (21%) SINCE THE **2008** HOMELESS COUNT. THIS SPEAKS TO THE **SUCCESS** OF THE **HOUSING FIRST** APPROACH AND THE WORK OF **HOMeward TRUST**, THE **HOMELESS COMMISSION** AND THE AGENCIES AND INDIVIDUALS WORKING TOGETHER **TO END HOMELESSNESS** IN OUR COMMUNITY.

## Neighbourhoods

A neighbourhood is not defined by location; it's made up of something far greater – the collective feelings, experiences and commitments of the people within it.

We all want to live in neighbourhoods that are safe, have places to gather, offer affordable housing and where people know one another. To make it a reality, revitalization efforts must be led by residents so that the skills and passion for maintaining the neighbourhoods remain strong.

Assigned to at-risk communities, determined by increasing crime statistics, N.E.T. works with residents to stabilize environments, reduce and prevent crime and the fear of crime. The results and efforts of this program are very encouraging.

One example of this success is the Edmonton neighbourhood of Britannia Youngstown. Between 2007 and 2010, the neighbourhood has seen an amazing 32% reduction in crime. Families are enjoying life in a neighbourhood that is a safer place to live, work and play.

### The NET Difference:

Over the past 12 years, the Neighbourhood Empowerment Team (N.E.T.) concept has played an important role in the wellness of many communities in Edmonton. As a shared project of the Edmonton Police Service, City of Edmonton Community Services, The Family Centre and United Way, N.E.T. applies non-traditional policing responses to common and recurrent community issues.



## Support is One Call Away:

In a time of crisis, it is critical that people who need help can easily find it. United Way is working to provide all residents of the Alberta Capital Region with access to the 211 Information and Referral Service.

By calling 211, individuals are provided with access to information on a very broad spectrum including: employment needs, parenting support, counselling/support groups, health care, legal services and much more. This helpful service has grown to include more communities in the Capital Region and is now available to residents of Edmonton, Strathcona County, Leduc and Parkland County. In 2010, the 211 service provided assistance to more than 51,000 callers.

## Our Aging Population:

A community or neighbourhood is diverse – with many ethnic groups and cultures as well as age groups ranging from children and youth to adults and seniors. But our senior population is one of the most rapidly increasing in the Province of Alberta. In fact, projections indicate that by the year 2031, one in five Albertans will be over the age of 65.

In the most recent study, it was determined that 71% of seniors live in homes that they own. With this in mind, we recognize that measures must be in place to ensure our seniors are supported, comfortable, safe and remain in their own homes for as long as possible.

The Seniors Association of Greater Edmonton (SAGE) provides a program to contribute to the safety and well-being of seniors in the Capital Region. The Home Services program acts as a brokering service, connecting seniors to approved companies and screened workers who can provide home maintenance at an affordable rate. Services include: snow removal, yard maintenance, carpentry, general maintenance, painting, plumbing, companionship, housekeeping, and others. In 2010, this program was able to assist 1,078 seniors with quality and trusted home maintenance repair.

## Reaching Out

### Supporting our Capital Region Communities

Our United Way serves the entire Capital Region – whether through partners and agencies located in area municipalities or by people accessing services in Edmonton.

Recognizing the great expertise and unique challenges within these outlying areas, United Way established Community Investment Committees in a number of local communities including St. Albert, Strathcona County and Fort Saskatchewan. Community Investment Committees bring together relevant local stakeholders who best understand the needs of their own communities. These groups are provided with a pool of dollars to invest in priority needs within their communities. Each committee makes decisions on the programs that they will be supporting in the coming year.

The St. Albert Community Investment Committee supports an Outreach Worker for the St. Albert Rental Assistance Program. The position provides coordination of community services and resources to individuals and families so they can find appropriate housing. Additionally, the worker provides assistance to families and individuals with low income to access grants through the Municipal Sustainability Housing Program and Capital Enhancement Program. These programs provide financial assistance with monthly rent payments so families who might otherwise be faced with eviction are able to remain in their homes. United Way also provides funding to St. Albert Community Information and Volunteer Centre and St. Albert Parents' Place - both United Way Member Agencies.

In Strathcona County, the local Community Investment Committee chose to provide funding to two agencies: SAFFRON and the Strathcona County Boys and Girls Club. The funding for SAFFRON supports the Secure Connections Program, which teaches youth, parents and educators about internet safety and the impacts

of cyber bullying. At the Boys and Girls Club, the funding supports a Youth Outreach Worker who builds relationships with vulnerable youth and provides emotional support, mentorship, guidance, referrals and resources. We also have two United Way Member Agencies in Strathcona County: Strathcona Shelter Society and the Information and Volunteer Centre for Strathcona County.

The Fort Saskatchewan Community Investment Committee, which has been in place since 1998, supports the Fort Saskatchewan Families First Society as well as Parent Advocates Linking Special Services. The funding at the Families First Society supports the Family Violence Prevention Program while the funding at PALSS is directed at the Recreation Program, providing children and youth with disabilities a chance to participate in accessible recreational programming. In addition to some of the programs supported by the local Community Investment Committee, the Fort Saskatchewan Boys and Girls Club has been a United Way Member Agency since 1987.

United Way is also providing support to residents of Leduc and Parkland County through Member Agencies such as the Boys and Girls Club of Leduc and the Leduc and District Food Bank as well as through the expansion of the 211 Information and Referral Service. Additionally, many of the programs that we support within Edmonton provide service to individuals who choose to, and in many cases must come into the city to access services.

Our reach extends far beyond the City of Edmonton and we are extremely thankful for all of the support that we receive from businesses and individuals across the entire Alberta Capital Region.

## Collective Community Action

### Mobilizing Resources

In 2010, The Honourable A. Anne McLellan stepped forward with great enthusiasm to Chair the annual United Way Fundraising Campaign. With a trusted and committed volunteer cabinet team of 36 local business leaders behind her and Vice-Chair, Dr. Mike Percy, Dean of the University of Alberta's School of Business, our community rallied to raise the largest amount ever in the history of our United Way - \$21.1 million. This was an increase of \$500,000 over the 2009 achievement and certainly a testament to the hard work of our nearly 5,000 workplace volunteers and the generosity of more than 33,000 donors.

The results of our annual campaign are not just measured in dollars and cents, but also in the participation and engagement of our community. In 2010, there was a significant increase in community engagement activities from our stakeholders. With more than 2,800 volunteers participating, we were successful in hosting a total of 240 Days of Caring – this is an increase

of more than 26% over 2009. Considering there are 365 days in a year, we are especially proud of this collective community action.

Our volunteers hail from many different organizations across our region and participated in a variety of volunteer activities. Whether serving a hot meal to inner-city seniors at Operation Friendship, packing school supplies into backpacks at our InKind Centre or helping build a playground for the students of Connect Society at the fourth annual Engineering Day of Caring, participants echoed very similar sentiments about their experiences. Each felt a deepened sense of understanding about the many issues our community faces and how their contributions – both funding and time - make a difference in the lives of so many. And, throughout these volunteer experiences, many people have shared their own story with us, proving once again that our work in the community touches everyone.

One of the many programs that would not be possible without significant volunteer support is a twice-yearly event called Homeless Connect Edmonton. This is a broad-based community-inspired initiative, providing free appropriate services to people experiencing homelessness and those at risk of becoming homeless.

In one day and at one location, Homeless Connect provides opportunities for people to move out of homelessness, raises public awareness of homelessness in the community, and provides a vehicle for community involvement to address this important issue.

A range of services are provided, including: mental health assessments, library services, foot care, haircuts, immunizations, birth control, pre-natal support, laundry, housing information, employment and training services and much more.

In the past year, United Way provided significant assistance to ensure the successful execution of two Homeless Connect Events – one held in May and the second in October. We provided support on various committees including the Steering Committee, Volunteer Committees and Sponsorship Committees, and provided a United Way staff person to Co-Chair the event.

In 2010, a total of 3,000 people accessed dental care, haircuts, hot meals and medical care. Attendees were also given a free “Personal Care Kit” with donated items such as deodorant, shampoo, first aid items and soap. United Way volunteers packaged the kits at the United Way’s InKind Centre. The popularity of the program, with clients, volunteers, corporate supporters and community partners was overwhelming. We look forward to continued growth and participation in the future.

## Paying it Forward

### Doug's Story

In 2010, United Way's Tools for School program collected supplies and donations to prepare and distribute 9,468 backpacks to 13 school divisions in the Alberta Capital Region. This means that without this program, 9,468 children, would not have had the necessary supplies to start school and work toward academic success.

Doug, is the manager of the St. Albert Staples, and he is very passionate about the United Way initiative, Tools for School. Although Staples is a flagship sponsor of the program and encourages staff to get involved as a personal endeavour, for Doug, we knew there was something more that motivated him. As we interviewed him for the 2010 Discovery Speaker Series, his reason became more evident.

Doug is enthusiastic about helping kids he doesn't even know. He very much supports the act of sharing and his excitement spills over in his efforts with his employees and fellow managers. He advocates helping collect the school supplies at the store and then spends a Day of Caring at the United Way InKind Centre filling back packs. Listening to Doug talk, we could all see how much it meant to him to know that many people were gaining an appreciation for sharing and for helping others. He talked about how much

fun they had participating outside their work life and how the experience brought them closer together – as a manager, he felt like he bonded with his team of employees.

And then, after about 20 minutes of conversation, as we were wrapping up the video interview, Doug quietly and casually shared a very personal piece of information with us. He mentioned that he was raised in a single parent family – a family of seven kids – and that he and his siblings had to rely on a program like Tools for School for their school supplies. And, there it was - Doug's story. He didn't think his personal story was that big of a deal in the grand scheme of things, but sharing how his experience as a youngster shaped the way he lives his life was really the message. For Doug, helping his co-workers and colleagues to experience the joy he gets from sharing is the big deal. He leads by example and shows others how to pay it forward, and that's his way of paying it back.

## Time to Get Social:

In 2010, we embarked on a complete overhaul of our website, myunitedway.ca. With an extensive web and new media strategy in place, we launched the new site just one week before our Annual Campaign Kick-off luncheon. It included the use of several social media platforms including Twitter, Facebook, YouTube, Flickr and Poll Daddy, allowing us to reach more audiences in a more entertaining and interactive way.

By including a team of United Way staff members as regular website bloggers and video bloggers, we not only attracted more website visitors, we engaged them in conversations, and encouraged their opinions through comments on the blog posts. Between September and December 2010, myunitedway.ca saw 93,000 unique page views, an increase of 12,000 over the same time period in 2009.

By December 2010, just four months after the site went live, our My United Way Facebook page had 306 fans and our Twitter account had 403 followers. We were now connecting with our stakeholders and new audiences in real time – allowing them to participate in spreading our messages throughout their networks across the city, the province, the country and the world.

To officially launch the new website and social media strategy, we live-streamed our Annual Kick-off Lunch on September 15 over the internet, including a real time Twitter feed. Video screens were placed throughout the venue so our more than 700 guests could see their own tweets as well as messages coming from audience members watching the event online. This was a first for any United Way in Canada.

## Discovering Impact through Speakers:

There is no greater way to discover the impact of our collective efforts to address social issues than by hearing the true life experiences of those we have helped.

Throughout each year, we develop relationships with the many individuals who have been helped by our work. These individuals become our ambassadors and deliver the United Way message in our community.

In 2010, our Discovery Speaker video library was enhanced by three new videos bringing our total number of inspirational stories on video to 17. This video series made it possible for each and every workplace to be exposed to real stories and the benefit of their contribution to the success of the community. As well, in 2010, 144 live speaking engagements occurred in workplace campaigns, an opportunity for people to hear inspiring stories first hand.

Pilot was named through an online contest where our followers submitted names and then online daily voting determined the winner. Congratulations to Bev Burghardt for getting the most votes and naming our little bird, Pilot!

## Events of Awareness and Action:

United Way events continue to be a source of inspiration and engagement for our supporters. Over the last year, based on research conducted by MBA students from the University of Alberta, we modified the content of our events. As well, we reduced

the number of events during campaign time from three to two – Campaign Kick-off and Breakfast of Champions. This proved to be very successful for attendance with an average increase of 18% over 2009.

Specialized events also proved to be very successful. The fourth Annual Engineering Day of Caring included participation by 16 engineering firms and 71 volunteers completing structural projects at two United Way Member Agencies.

The first ever Mingle at the Mac reception was held at the Fairmont Hotel Macdonald to host and recognize small to medium size accounts. This was a sold-out event, made possible with the generous sponsorship of our corporate supporters.



## Rock, Paper Scissors!

### Workplace Campaigns put the FUN in Fundraising

Not only did United Way find new ways to engage and inspire our donors, but our supporters found unique ways to engage and inspire each other, too! Not since the winter games in Vancouver last February has there been a competition quite as exciting.
