


262,914 people who were struggling received support from United Way of the Alberta Capital Region funding, initiatives, and programs.

**8,509 caregivers and children** received early learning and parenting supports through United Way funding.






89% of caregivers accessing United Way-funded resources were better able to support their children's healthy development.





**82% of children and youth** accessing United Way-funded supports improved their self esteem, problem-solving or coping skills.






1,993 students and their families accessed wraparound supports through United Way's All in for Youth collaborative.

1,271 people took part in United Way's Each One, Teach One financial literacy workshops.






**1,260 people** got help to find and keep their job through United Way-funded employment training.
